#### Intermediaries...

- Can sustain trust through political shifts that may impact the SEA
- Can uphold unapologetic equity stance
- Can amplify the impact of capacitybuilding investments
- Foster both original innovation & scaling of innovation through approximation
- Can be more responsive to local contexts, especially when funded flexibly
- Often have greater ability to probe and sense from the field
- Often see complexity sooner and can better respond to complexity
