



Transformative Learning Experiences (TLEs)




- Project Based Unit of Study
- Promotes Deeper Learning
- Develops College and Career Ready Competencies
- Makes Learning Relevant
- Fosters Rigorous Thinking and Student Work





Key Components of a Transformative Learning Experience

The design of a Transformative Learning Experience consists of five core components, which are designed in a specific order and back-mapped from prioritized competencies.






Experts in Practice

Experts at Opportunity Academy in Holyoke, MA

Opportunity Academy is a set of alternative high school pathways that allow students to continue or restart on a pathway to a diploma if they are not succeeding at Holyoke High School's main campuses.

Mission: Our school empowers learners who were previously disengaged with school to develop their academic, and socioemotional skills; and to envision and achieve a rewarding life. We accomplish this by prioritizing transformative relationships, robust and relevant project-based learning, and learning opportunities that extend beyond our school's walls.






How do TLEs and experts engage students and support their learning?

Initial data and anecdotal evidence show that students doing TLEs are more engaged and accumulating credits faster than students who have not experienced TLEs.

- In-Person PayDay Loans:
 Student Participant +18%
 attend. increase
 cycle-over-cycle
- Remote TLEs:
 - Top 9 credit* earners:2 TLE's+
 - Top 15 credit earners: 1 TLE+





At Opportunity Academy, a Transformative Learning Experience focused on slam poetry featured an entry event starring Usman Hameedi, an award-winning slam poet, teaching artist, and scientist.





Usman performed and guided students in analyzing and digesting his work. He also showed slam poetry videos that featured different themes and devices, and facilitated an activity for students to try their hands at slam.

Nowell Leadership Academy's mission is to ensure that Rhode Island's pregnant, parenting and underserved youth graduate from high school with the knowledge and skills they need to be prepared for success in college, career and family life.

- Serving 160 students
- 91% receive FRPL
- Two-thirds are pregnant or parenting
- 89% of Nowell's 2019
 graduating class enrolled
 in a professional
 certification program, a
 two-year college or a
 four-year college.

Nowell Leadership Academy has conducted in-person expert touch points with local experts as well as virtually with national experts.

IN PERSON:

Students wrote short stories that they pitched to actual writers and publishers at the bookstore, "An Unlikely Story" owned and operated by Jeff Kinny in Plainville, MA.

VIRTUAL:

A STEM class focused on building a city was joined by an engineer and scientist.






How can food be an avenue to empowerment, social justice and (re) building community?
