- 3. **\*Presentation Format and Length**: Choose one presentation format that is most appropriate for your session. (Select one.)
  - <u>Power Session</u> (20 minutes): These are short, impactful, powerful bursts of knowledge sharing on a critical topic facing the field (similar to a TED Talk). The goal is to inspire, shift mindsets, provide key takeaways or guidance, and/or share resources for participants to learn more.
  - <u>Panel Session</u> (60 minutes): The purpose of this format is to bring together multiple presenters to share key knowledge and engage with participants on a particular topic. This lifts up the experiences and perspectives of various experts, including those closest to the issue (educators and/or students). The panel moderator should be included in this proposal as a presenter.
  - <u>Pop-Up Problem of Practice</u> (60 minutes): This format involves presenters identifying a series of problems in practice (or policy) that the field is grappling with, then breaking participants into smaller groups to discuss their experiences and insights with the issue at hand, then coming back together as a full group and sharing out recommendations. These sessions target and unpack the specific nuances of implementation, digging below the surface, and lifting up promising solutions. The goal is to advance breakthrough practices, building participant knowledge on ways to lead education innovation and address complex issues facing the field.
  - <u>Programs to Watch</u> (20 minutes): These sessions are geared to spotlight emerging programs. We are seeking presenters who are educators just getting started in transitioning to personalized, competency-based education systems. They will share their vision, highlight their progress, map their initial implementation steps and hurdles, and offer their contact information to practitioners who might be interested in connecting with them.
  - Ignite Session (10 minutes): This fast-paced session is designed for experts to share a quick burst of groundbreaking ideas, inspiring the audience, building understanding, and shifting thinking in new ways. The presentations should aim for no more than 20 slides, spending approximately 30 seconds on each.
- 4. \*Level of Interactivity: Each attendee, depending upon their personal learning journey and learning goals, has different needs and expectations for engaging in a virtual environment. For example, attendees who are just getting started may appreciate an information-sharing session with less interactivity, whereas other attendees may be seeking to make new connections and would benefit from highly interactive sessions. It is important for attendees to know the level of engagement they can expect when they choose to attend each session in a virtual setting. Here are three levels of interactivity and corresponding definitions:
  - <u>Interactivity Level 101</u>: This session is designed to be mostly presentation-style for information sharing and knowledge building among participants. Presenters will share key information and guidance, along with slide decks and/or other key resources. There are minimal other interactive elements, limited mostly to chatbox discussions and Q&A.
  - <u>Interactivity Level 201</u>: This involves a combination of a traditional presentation and interactive elements. Interactive components may include sharing slides and other key resources, Q&A, polling, annotation exercises, and/or the use of external working documents or tools. This level of interactivity is designed to strike a balance between enabling some participant engagement while building knowledge through more traditional sharing of key information.
  - Interactivity Level 301: This involves frequent multi-directional communication among

presenters and participants throughout the session, which may include a combination of breaking into smaller discussion groups then sharing back out with the main audience, group participation in a shared document, Q&A, annotation exercises, rich dialogue via the chatbox, and other highly interactive features. Attendees can expect to participate fully and engage deeply with other participants. There are minimal "sit-and-get" components.
