

Critical Student Experiences



Affirming Identities

Students feel more connected to and motivated in classes that affirm their background.



Meaningful Work

Students need to understand how schoolwork is relevant to their own lives and goals.



Classroom Community

Students need to feel a sense of community, mutual support among peers, and affirmation to feel safe and connected.



Student Voice

Students take ownership of their learning through sharing their knowledge and perspectives in the classroom.



Feedback for Growth

Students need supportive feedback that helps them recognize their own potential to grow.



Teacher Caring

Students need to feel valued and respected in the learning environment.

Why do Learning Conditions Matter?

Students are more engaged, and learning outcomes are more equitable when every student has affirming learning experiences—when they experience psychological safety, caring relationships, personally relevant content, and agency.

Design Considerations for Teachers


- Feedback: Rapid, actionable feedback (not evaluative!)
- Research-based Practices: Concrete, research-based strategies for improving students' learning environments
- Collaboration:
 Collaborative
 professional learning
 opportunities
- Trust & Support





What is Elevate?

A professional learning program that elevates students voice to help educators create engaging and equitable experiences that support academic and socialemotional learning.





What can you <u>measure</u> & improve with Elevate?



Affirming Identities

"I see positive examples of people like me in the things we learn in this class."



Meaningful Work

"What we learn in this class is connected to real-life"



Classroom Community

"I feel comfortable sharing my thoughts and opinions in this class"



Student Voice

"In this class, my ideas are taken seriously"



Feedback for Growth

"In this class, it is okay to make mistakes because we can learn from them."



Teacher Caring

"I feel like this teacher is glad that I am in their class."



Four Simple Steps



1. Elevate Student Voice

A 5-10 minute, customizable <u>survey</u> sheds light on the way students are experiencing each class.



2. Review Feedback

A confidential <u>report</u> shows how students' experiences are promoting or hindering equitable learning.



3. Learn & Apply New Practices

A <u>pratice guide</u> provides teacher-tested strategies and activities that can be applied right away.




4. Make Improvements

Repeat the survey to see how students experience new practices. Repeat steps 1-3 to <u>keep improving</u>.

Elevate 2020-2021 participation at a glance

- Over 600 teachers at over 50 schools used Elevate to collect actionable feedback from their students, and those teachers taught over 35,000 students this year (over 27k were surveyed).
- 79% of teachers improved student experience when they used Elevate over multiple cycles of inquiry and action.
- Some educator teams shifted experience dramatically, e.g.,
 - 56% growth in affirming cultural identity in science classes
 - 36% growth in computer science being seen as meaningful
 - Black & Latinx students 2x more likely to feel belonging.
