- Colorado school districts equitably, predictably, reliably produce "Running Kid" outcomes
- Colorado communities embrace a broader understanding of school quality [student success]
- 3. Colorado maximizes the policy and funding opportunities of recovery to enable breakthrough change that drives equity and relevance in high school

History on Rethinking Accountability

- CEI published a series of white papers on the topic of accountability in 2018
- Two statewide convenings on rethinking accountability in 2018 and 2019
- SB 19-204 passed in 2019 creating the Local Accountability System Grantee Pilot Program – 11 grantees representing 41 districts, schools, and BOCES; CEI contracted to facilitate and support learning network of grantee pilots
- HB 21-1294 passed in 2021 calling for an audit of the state accountability system throughout 21-22


Worksheet: Parent-Teacher Planning Tool
