Student Representatives in D.C.

- Four total student members.
 - At least one student member must go to school or live in Ward 7 or 8 to ensure more accurate representations of students in the district.
- Student representatives vote on resolutions. These votes are recorded but not counted.
 - Students can sit (and have a full vote) in other committees.
- Co-chairs of the Student Advisory Committee



Student Advisory Committee

The Student Advisory Committee (SAC) serves to advise the work of the board and must be consulted and give statement on resolutions before they are passed.

The SAC also works on projects that can be divorced from resolutions of the SBOE.






- 20% of the respondents shared that they would like to have a trusted adult at their schools.
 - Some shared that they don't share about their mental health, or that they share but are not being helped.


 Students shared that an overload of assignments, class exams, lack of organization, classes being too hard and COVID procedures all contributed as school based stressors this past year.

More crossing guards around


More school buses


Student Engagement Checklist


- Regard students as experts in education
