- Capstone for over a decade





What is a Capstone Project?

- Project that is student-designed, student-driven
- Student's passions, interests or career goals
- Exhibition with an authentic audience
- Demonstrate the vision of a graduate skills
- Extended period of time
- Self-reflection throughout the process
- Junior/Senior year of HS

What is a Personal Interest Project (PIP)?

- Capstone "lite"
 - Shorter time frame
 - Less research
 - Fewer activities
- 5th-12th grade





Portrait of a Graduate

- Skills include: Communication, Collaboration, Problem Solving, Critical and Creative Thinking, Research/Information Literacy, Creativity, Community/Environmental/Civic Engagement
- Authentic assessments for real world skills
- Opportunities to practice skills, fail, try again
- Capstone/PIP is about process over product; marshalling all the resources to get a project done



Capstone/PIP in a WIDE Range of Settings

- 1 semester/trimester course
- Full year course
- Independent project outside of class time
- Part of an advisory program
- Part of an academic course
- Gifted and Talented
- All students participate
- Some students participate by opting in



Can determine honors, distinction

What do colleges say about Capstone?

- Differentiates students beyond APs, IB, Honors classes
- Many students write about Capstone as part of their college application
- Demonstrates non-academic skills colleges are looking for
- Projects can be shared with schools

- Aligned to the Portrait of the Graduate
- Scaffold from thinking about interests all the way through completed project

 - Self Direction



Skills Alignment

- Communication initial pitch and peer feedback, final presentation, blog, trailer video
- Research and Understanding Annotated bibliography, application of research to action
