Requirements:

The Aurora Institute Symposium Conference offers an opportunity for attendees to build knowledge about next generation learning models. Conference attendees examine practices and policies that will usher in the future of learning by drawing on the collective wisdom and expertise of education leaders, practitioners, policymakers, researchers, and decision-makers from around the country and the globe who are engaged in K-12 education innovations. This three-day conference will be full of active learning, critical examination of the most pressing issues in K-12 education, rigorous exploration of new models and supportive policy levers, dynamic investigations into how districts are managing and leading innovation, and full immersion into personalized, student-oriented pedagogy.

Assignments for 1 Graduate-Level Credit:

- A. Make a copy of your certificate of attendance or a pic of your badge. (Proof of registration)
- B. Attend a minimum of 8 hours of conference sessions. This usually means 8 one-hour sessions or equivalent hours of longer workshops.
- C. Write a brief summary of each session/workshop attended. Summarize the session in 150-250 words. Cover the following topics:
 - What can I apply to my teaching?

- What were the strengths?
- What would have made this session/workshop more valuable to me?
- Include the email address of at least one of the presenters

Assignments for 2 Graduate-Level Credits: (In addition to requirements above)

- A. Attendance at 5 additional hours of conference sessions. (Write up each session as above)
- B. Attend at least 1 keynote session. Write a 2-page reflection on the implications of the presentation for education focusing on your school community in particular.
- C. Share your conference experience! Introduce the ideas from the conference to either
 - Your Classroom Curriculum
 - A Faculty Presentation
 - o Training of Staff
 - Department Sharing
 - PTA Presentation
 - o Other

Write up or design a presentation that you can use to share your conference ideas this group of people.

Accreditation & Types of Credits/Units
